EVOLUTION IN TRANSPORTATION: INCREMENTAL STEPS TOWARDS OPTIMIZATION

MAY 3 & 4, FAIRMONT HOTEL, WINNIPEG

The 2018 Spring Member Forum will explore opportunities to advance the Western Canadian transportation system within the next five years. Change is complicated, especially in an industry with such a diverse stakeholder community and complex history. The aim of the meeting is to assess the options available to move the industry forward in more incremental ways versus the focus on disruptive forces that has dominated recent discussions.

At the Forum, members will discuss ways some companies are changing and creating capacity in the system by rethinking transportation using innovation, technology, or a shift in practice or roles. They will also look at how government is influencing change through leadership in data and visibility and the reviews of policies on core transportation elements (pilotage, Seaway and ports).

Finally, members will have the opportunity to discuss recent developments in North American rail service. Throughout the day, Western provincial Ministers will offer perspectives on the "State of Transportation across the West."

The WESTAC Leaders Council**, on day two, will delve further into the subject of Western Canada's rail system by focusing on the actions that can be taken by all stakeholders in the short and long term to increase efficiency in the rail networks.
