Canada talks about trade diversification. Delivering it is another matter.

We are already a global exporting success story, with deep trade ties and firms that compete effectively in international markets. Our economic strength will continue to be anchored in the United States, which will remain Canada's primary trading partner. In that context, this year's CUSMA review is critical—not only to safeguard market access, but to provide the certainty Canadian exporters need to invest, scale, and compete. At the same time, maintaining the status quo will not deliver the next phase of export growth.

If Canada is serious about doubling non-U.S. exports, trade diversification must be treated as a core competitiveness agenda, not a secondary geopolitical objective. That requires sharper execution and harder choices: focusing on markets where Canadian firms can genuinely win, aligning infrastructure and programs with commercial realities, and ensuring our trade and innovation systems are built to support scale. Global demand exists; the challenge is whether Canada is prepared to compete for it with discipline and intent.

The WESTAC Spring Member Forum is designed to be a grounded, forward-looking conversation that connects global strategy to on-the-ground realities for exporters. The Forum will challenge participants to think differently about trade diversification: not as a hedge against the U.S. market, but as a deliberate, long-term competitiveness agenda that enables Canadian businesses to win globally.

### WESTAC LEADERS' COUNCIL

The Leaders' Council session will begin with Transport Canada presenting updated commodity forecasts for Western Canada and how trade flows could evolve as Canada works toward the federal objective of doubling non-U.S. exports by 2035. Officials will introduce their scenario-based analytical framework and outline how different economic and policy conditions could shape future export patterns and transportation demand. The discussion will also touch on the federal strategy to support trade diversification, including the recently announced Trade Diversification Corridors Fund, as well as a brief update on work related to paperless trade.

The session will then turn to the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority's rail modelling analysis looking ahead to 2037, which examines potential pressure points across the rail network as trade volumes grow.

The discussion will conclude with a comparison of the two forecasting approaches and invite members to share perspectives on how well the projections reflect on-the-ground realities and what they imply for Canada's transportation system as it supports trade diversification.

Jeff Nankivell joined APF Canada as President and CEO on September 7, 2021.

Prior to this, he had a 33-year career in Canada's Foreign Service. He held various positions at the Canadian International Development Agency between 1988 and 2008, working on programs related to China, Russia, strategic policy, and international financial institutions. A fluent Mandarin speaker, he was posted three times to Canada's embassy in Beijing—in the development assistance section 1991-95 and 2000-04, and as Deputy Head of Mission 2008-11.

From 2011 to 2016, Jeff served in Ottawa/Gatineau as Director General responsible for Canada's official development assistance programs across Asia, first with the Canadian International Development Agency and then with Global Affairs Canada. In 2016 he was appointed Consul General of Canada in Hong Kong and Macao, serving in Hong Kong until May 2021.

Jeff holds a Master's degree in political sociology from the London School of Economics, BA in international relations from the University of Toronto and Université Laval, and certificate (one-year program) in Chinese language and culture from the Chinese University of Hong Kong.
